BSU Mural Project

It was the idea of sophomore Leeanna Strond, art director for the Black Student Union, back in March of this year to design a mural for the school as a gift from this year's BSU. The original concept was to have the painting adorn the outside of the building, in front of the courtyard on the Ellis Lane side of the building. After much deliberation, planning and consulting, it was decided that the mural would be done on the inside of the building in one of the two main corridors upon entering the building.

Together with the help of BSU officers Brooklynn Woods and Aiza McCollum, a proposal was drafted to present to Principal Kevin Fagan. The project endured many revisions but the final version was approved by Mr. Fagan in late April. The image depicts an urban city-scape with the letters BSU super imposed and literally bursting through the buildings in a 3D effect. By Mid-May the mural was taking shape with the team of BSU members Leeanna Strond, (sophomore), Brooklynn Woods (senior) and Azyana "Star" Hardeman (junior) unifying their artistic vision. This creative work of art will be a continuing legacy from the BSU to be enjoyed by all.

Project Helios Balloon Launch

Led by Physics teacher, Ron Pedelty, a dozen EHS students hit the road on Saturday, May 31st, headed for an open field in Gettysburg, the designated launch site for the Project Helios balloon launch. After arriving shortly after 6 A.M., Mr. Pedelty, the students, and parents, assembled the instruments, cameras, and tracking electronics. By 7 A.M., they started to inflate the balloon, which grew to over 6 feet in diameter before it was determined that it had enough lift for the equipment. Although the balloon is very fragile (designed to burst when it reaches maximum altitude), the package lifted off successfully shortly after 8:00.

The test balloons and computer simulations predicted that the balloon would be carried south, over Washington D.C., which, in fact, by about 11 A.M., it did. A map of the flight path is shown below. The group followed it into Maryland, where it finally settled in the top of a very tall tree in the woods on private property.

Although the GPS tracker continues to provide updates from the top of the tree, there's really no way to retrieve the box until it decides to fall on its own. That could be days from now, or years. In any case, it has already been an exciting and educational experience for all of the students and parents involved. Once the data is retrieved, Mr. Pedelty and students will put together a presentation of their adventures and the videos and data from space.

Mr. Pedelty would like to thank all for your interest and support of Project Helios, and would especially like to thank Paul Joyce, who first conceived of the project and secured the generous grant, Mike Masha, who supplied the much-needed helium (and a lot of it!), and the parents who helped out with the driving and tracking.

The Varsity team tied for 3rd place with a record of 8-1; their only loss came in the semi-final round to the eventual winner, Horace Greeley from New York.


The JV team came in second after losing a very close match in the finals to Briarcliff. Their overall record was 6-2.

updated 6/2 - Emily rode in the Locals Division at Devon, a mixed division of teenagers and adults. She received a 1st place champion ribbon along with placing 3rd, 5th, and 8th out of 35 riders in her division group. She qualified for the Working Hunter-Fox Hunter Performance Division and out of 12 competitors, placed 3rd. Her horse also received The Best Mover Award out of both Local Division groups of 70 riders.

Emily Von Urff competes in horse riding competitions around the country. She won champion in Zone 2, as part of the USEF/ USHJA yearly 2013 finals. There are 12 Zones in the United States, each with approximately 10 riding divisions. In 2013, Emily won champion in the Children's Hunter 14 and Under Division. At Horse Shows in the Sun (HITS), a national show held this past winter, she placed in the top 4 out of 13 riders for her first week, top 7 out of 29 riders her second week, and top 5th out of 18 riders, with a first place in her Handy class, in her third week. Emily will be competing at the Devon Horse Show for her fourth year in the Locals Division, a mixed division of children and adults.

Student to Perform Solo Cello Concert at Carnegie Hall

On February 23rd, Alex Chen auditioned for the Golden Key Music Festival. Golden Key is an international competition that is divided up into a United States competition and a Vienna, or European, Competition. The United States Festival was established in 2002 and features applicants from all around the nation as well as the neighboring countries. The judges range from music educators and performers from prestigious music colleges around the world, such as Rachmaninov State Conservatory in Russia, Academy of Music in Wroclaw, Shanghai Conservatory in China, Manhattan School of Music and The Juilliard School in New York. Alex auditioned with Saint-Saens' *Allegro Appassionato*. The competition was divided into seven age groups and he won as the youngest in his age group, 16 -18. He won gold prize and will perform a solo cello concert at Carnegie Hall this evening as part of the winner's recital.


